Created in 1976 by the Alaska Legislature, the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) is a public corporation of the State of Alaska governed by a board of directors with the mission to "reduce the cost of energy in Alaska." AEA is the state's energy office and lead agency for statewide energy policy and program development.

State Energy Security Plan (SESP) Overview





- AEA receives annual formula funds from the State Energy Program (SEP) administered by the United States Department of Energy.
- The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
 changed the requirements of the SEP specifically
 requiring states to develop an Energy Assurance
 /Security plan.
- To meet these requirements, and continue to be eligible for federal SEP funds, AEA competitively procured a contract with ICF to develop the SESP.

- - People




- Enhance the response to, and recovery from, energy disruptions
